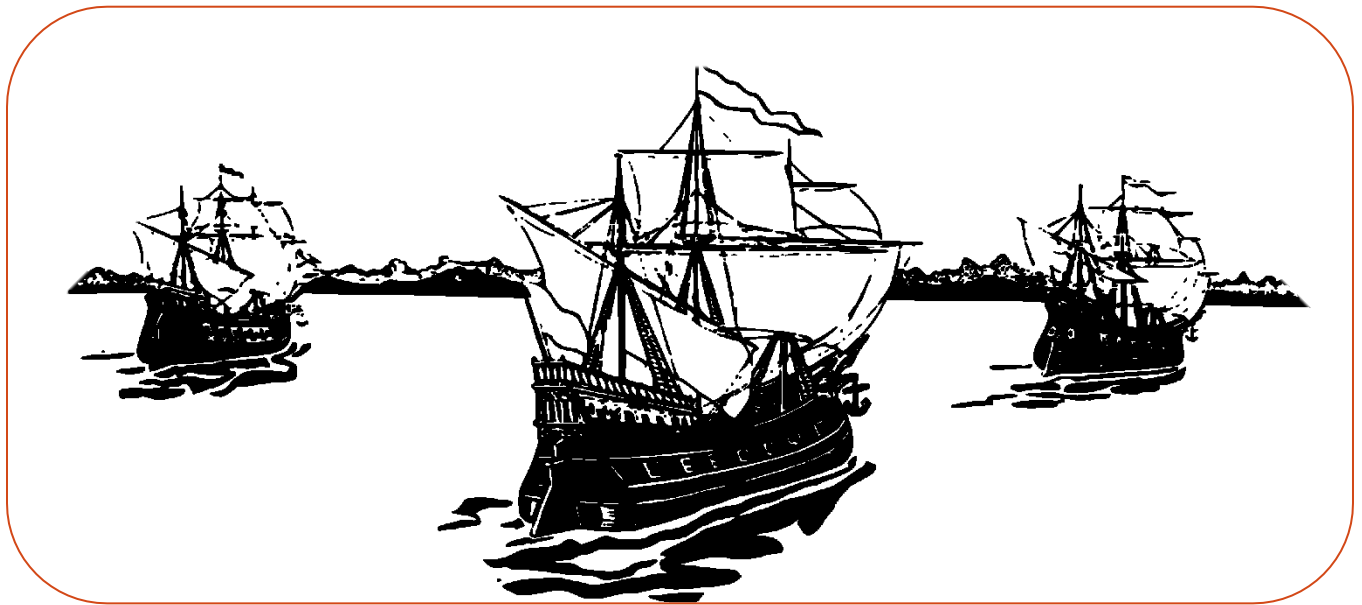

To Register

A-1 Dialectic Behavior Therapy (DBT)

Presenter: Linda Burton, MCCMH

Learn about this evidenced-based treatment designed to effectively treat those who suffer from chronic suicidal behaviors and Borderline Personality Disorder. DBT targets behaviors such as high-risk suicidal behaviors/thoughts, self-harm, impulsive behaviors, coping with PTSD, and many others.

A-2 Martha T. Berry - Adult Day Services

Presenter: Jane Yanez

Learn about Macomb County's Adult Day Service program that provides the benefits of both Social and Medical models of care for individuals with physical and mental disabilities, allowing them to remain in a home setting while still receiving opportunities for socialization, supervision, and medical care.

A-3 Community Housing Network

Community Housing Network will provide information on how interested participants can locate and secure safe, affordable housing in Macomb County, what programs are available to assist, and how the coordinated entry system works to serve households in crisis.

A-4 Children's Special Health Care Services

CSHCS is a program within the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services. It focuses on family-centered, culturally-competent, community-based and coordinated services for children and some adults with eligible health conditions.

B-1 E-cigarettes What's the Big Deal?

C-1 Training and Treatment Innovations (TTI)

Presenters: Monica Miller, April Ceno and Sara Rizzuto.

TTI provides a wide range of community-based specialty mental health services to adults with serious and persistent mental disorders, developmental disabilities and/or substance use disorders. They also offer services and supports to children with developmental disabilities and/or serious emotional impairment.

C-2 What is Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorder (FASD)?

Presenters: Kayla Dadswell, CARE of SEM

Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorders (FASD) can occur in an individual prenatally exposed to alcohol. These effects may include physical, mental, behavioral, and/or learning disabilities with life-long implications. Learn why prevention of alcohol during pregnancy is needed and where resources can be found.

C-3 Sacred Heart - Women's Specialty Services

Learn about their women's specialty services, which incorporate a variety of health, parenting, child care, case management, specialized medical care and additional services with a course of substance abuse treatment in an all-female service environment which is free from the distractions of a co-ed setting.

D-1 Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs)

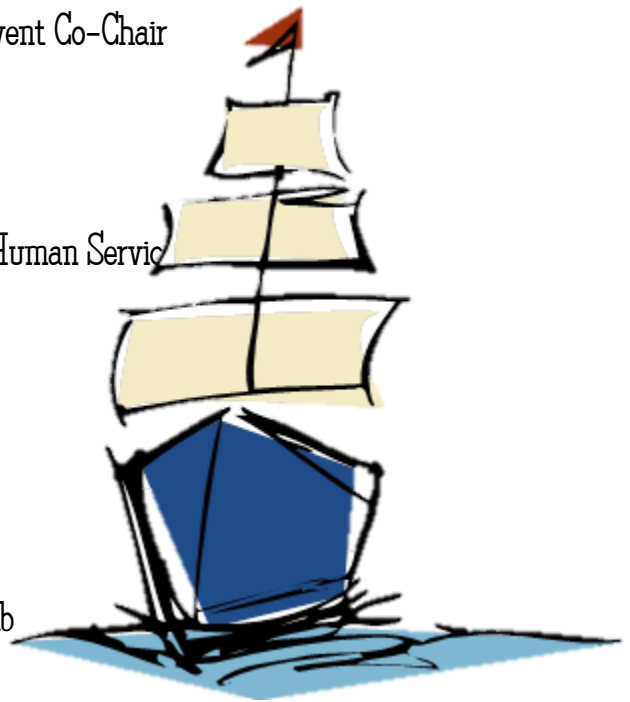
