Assessing and Treating Victims of Human Trafficking

MCCMH AND MCOSA PRESENT A TRAUMA-INFORMED TRAINING ON HUMAN TRAFFICKING

This presentation will focus on identifying different forms of human trafficking and the traumatic experiences victims of human trafficking undergo. The psychological and physical health consequences on the mind and body will be explored. Co-morbid disorders will be identified in this specialized population. Factors, including addiction, which may predispose individuals to becoming victims of human trafficking will be explored.

Participants will be able to:

- 1) Name the different types of human trafficking.
- 2) Cite the health problems associated with human trafficking.
- 3) Summarize the association between type of trauma inflicted on victims and associated disorders.
- 4) Identify vulnerabilities which may play a role in becoming a victim of human trafficking.
- 5) Identify the co-morbid disorders, including substance abuse, associated with human trafficking.
- 6) Summarize how addiction may play a role in perpetuating human trafficking.
- 7) Identify various treatments available in shaping recovery from trauma as well as associated substance use disorders.

Dr. Ward specializes in the treatment of trauma, post-partum depression, self-injury, and eating disorders. She is a national trainer for Mental Health First Aid, a course designed to give individuals the tools to assist others who may be developing a mental illness or related crisis situation.
