Course Description

Prevention Prepared Communities (PPC) operate as systems of prevention in communities across the United States. Prevention Prepared Communities involve creating communities where individuals, families, schools, faith-based organizations, and workplaces take action to promote emotional health and reduce the likelihood of mental illness, substance abuse, and suicide. (SAMHSA) The Prevention Prepared Communities training is predicated on provider agencies role and responsibility in producing outcomes (systems, behavioral, and process outcomes) for the individuals and communities they serve. This training provides them the capacity to do so.

The community coalition or task force is the major vehicle to build systems of prevention and prevention prepared communities. This training offering will provide insights into how to build and sustain a Prevention Prepared Community utilizing the Strategic Prevention Framework as its guide. With this training, coalitions will have the ability to act and formally address any issue or concern by aligning stakeholders, prevention efforts, ROSC and Integrated Care opportunities, address stigma, and expand and braid funding / resources to align with the state and federal direction surrounding PPCs.
